#### **General Information**

Minors under 18 years of age must receive a 30-minute meet period after 5 consecutive hours of work.

Minors under 16 years of age may not be employed during the hours they are required to attend school.

Read working papers carefully. They contain information that is important to you. Papers are valid only for the period of time and conditions stated

#### **Records Requirements**

For all minors under the age of 16, except those engaged in domestic service in private homes, and in agricultural pursus, and for those minors between 18 and 18 years of see employed during the months of June, July, August or September by a summer real-dist came, conference or retriast operated by a magnetic or realptus corporation or association.

Name, address, date of birth, hours of beginning and ending daily work periods and meel periods, number of hours worked each day, and wages paid to each minor.
